Coaches and Managers

The Child Protection Designated Person will:

- Act as the first point of contact for the reporting of child welfare and protection concerns.
- Help and safeguard children/young people by assisting in the promotion and implementation of the *FA Child Protection and Best Practice Guide* at Club level.
- Assist in the raising of awareness of other at the Club in relation to child protection.
- Be a source of advice and information within the Club.
- Uphold confidentiality, as far as is practical in all child protection matters.
- Liase with the County Child Protection Officer.
- Keep a record of all accidents/injuries and illness occasioned whilst playing/training or representing the Club at any level.

Club Rules

Norristhorpe Juniors & Junior Bees Football Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members (non playing and playing). The Club believes that it is important that players, coaches, Committee Members and parents associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect to all. They are encouraged to be open at all times and share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with the Manager/Coach/Committee Member or Child Protection Designated Person.

As a member (Non playing or playing) of Norristhorpe Juniors & Junior Bees Football Club you are expected to abide by the rules of the Club and the code of conduct.

1. All players must play football within the laws and in the spirit of the game.
2. All members (Non playing or playing) must respect colleagues, opponents and officials. Do not make derogatory comments or gestures about your colleagues or opponents. Never try to intimidate the opposition by threats or excessive triumphalism.
3. Be polite to match officials and respect their decisions.
4. Players/parents should keep to the agreed time for training and matches or inform their coach or team manager at the earliest possible opportunity if they cannot play or are going to be late.
5. All players must wear the appropriate kit for training. Full Club kit and suitable football boots and shin pads must be worn for matches.
6. When training indoors the rules of the premises being used for the purpose must be adhered to at all times. Footballs should only be used in the designated training areas.
7. Club fundraising events should be supported fully.
8. Adhere to all rules set out in the constitution of the Club.

Code of Conduct for Parents/Carers

1. Encourage your child/young person to learn the laws of the game and to play within the laws and spirit of the same.
2. Discourage unfair play and disputes with match officials and coaches.
3. Help the child/young person recognise good performance and not just results.
4. Never force your child to take part in any sport.
5. Set a good example by recognising fair play and by applauding the good performance of all.
6. Never punish or belittle your child/young person for losing or making a mistake.
7. Publicly accept the judgement of match officials without argument or comment.
8. Support your child/young person's involvement and help them to enjoy football and to develop within it.
9. Use correct and proper language at all times
10. Do not forget your child/young person is involved in football for their enjoyment and not yours.
